2. Biography of Alice Munro

Alice Munro was born on July, 10th 1931 and grew up in Wingham, Ontario, Canada. Her father, Robert Eric Laidlaw, was a fox and mink farmer, and her mother, Anne Clarke Laidlaw, was a schoolteacher. She is Canadian short stories writer who won the Nobel Prize in Literature in 2013. After high school spent two years at the University of Western Ontario, married, and moved to British Columbia. She returned to southwestern Ontario in 1972 and now she lives in the town of Clinton with her second husband.

Munro began writing as a teenager, publishing her first story, “The Dimensions of a shadow”, in 1950 while studying English and Journalism at the University of Western Ontario. During this period she worked as a waitress, a tobacco picker, and a library clerk.

Her work is familiar to a wide audience in both Canada and the United States. In 1968 her first book of stories, *Dance of the Happy Shades*, won her Canada’s highest literary prize, the Governor General Award. Her second book, the much-acclaimed novel *Lives of Girl and Women* (also available from Signet), was published in 1971 and won the Canadian Booksellers Association International Book Year Award. Both books were met with unequivocal praise when subsequently published in the United States and Great Britain. Her second collection of short stories, *Something I’ve been meaning to Tell You*, was published by NAL in 1975. In 1978, Munro’s collection of interlinked stories *Who Do You Think You*

published (titled *The Beggar Maid: Stories of Flo and Rose* in the United States) this book earned Munro a second Governor General’s Literary Award. She



toured Australia, China and Scandinavia for public appearances and readings from 1979 to 1982.
